TERENA organises SCAMPI session on Internet traffic monitoring

On 21 May 2003, the SCAMPI project organised a birds-of-a-feather session in Zagreb, Croatia, co-located with the TERENA Networking Conference and CARNet User Conference 2003. The programme was organised by TERENA's Kevin Meynell.

The discussion session featured four presentations by participants in the SCAMPI project. Kevin Meynell gave a short general introduction about SCAMPI, a project in the European Union's 5th Framework Programme to develop a scalable monitoring platform for the Internet and promote the use of monitoring tools for improving services and technology. Vasilios Siris of the Institute of Computer Science of FORTH, Greece discussed the use of measurements to detect denial-of-service attacks and anomalies. Luca Deri of NETikos, Italy gave a presentation on the issues involved in monitoring networks at Gigabit speeds. As the last speaker, Herbert Bos of Leiden University, the Netherlands presented OKE: the Open Kernel Environment.
